WHAT is Aarigaa?

Aarigaa is a ministry that partners with local churches to reach out and disciple young adults between the ages of 18 and 25.

WHO is it for?

Aarigaa is for Alaskan college-age young adults, and their friends.

We meet in people's houses, at church, outside, in many places!


WHY do we meet?
